



Spokane County USBC Points Scholarship Information

Requirements:

1. Scholarship applicants must be current members bowling in a league certified by the SCUSBC bowling association
2. Youth bowlers in grades 9 -12 may submit applications yearly and their points will accumulate, however, scholarships will only be awarded to high school seniors. The money will be sent to SMART so the winner may access the funds at time of enrollment.
3. The season's top point earning senior will receive a \$500.00 SMART scholarship to be used towards a two or four year college program (online courses qualify) a business, trade, technical, or vocational school. Additional Scholarships may be awarded if the funds are available.
4. How and where applicants receive points:
 - a. Grade point average (Enclose a copy of most recent report card or counselor's verification)
 - b. Local and state tournaments bowled, with verification (Attach copy of recap sheet or have the Tournament Director write scores and sign their name and date)
 - c. Junior League participation, must complete 2/3 of the season (Enclose standing sheet to show number of games bowled for the season)
 - d. Volunteering as an association board director, committee member or participation in a coaching clinic
 - e. Junior Bowling Tournaments (JBT's)
 - f. Pepsi Tournament Participation
 - g. Jr. Gold Participation

5. Point System:

Grade Point Average (GPA)	Points
3.8 to 4.0	40 points
3.5 to 3.79	25 points
3.0 to 3.49	15 points
2.5 to 2.99	10 points
2.49 to 2.0	5 points



a. Tournaments	5 points	Examples: Washington State Youth Championships
b. Leagues	10 points	Must bowl 2/3 of each league
c. Association Board Director, Committee member or Coaching Clinic	5-30points	Participant or volunteer. Participation must be verified by SCUSBC Board President
d. JBT's	10 points (1st JBT) then 5 points for each additional	Including Spokane JBT's as well as PNW JBT and the Washington JBT
e. Pepsi Tournament	5 points	Additional 5 pts for each advancement level
f. Jr. Gold	10 pts	

6. Lower Classmen may earn “roll-over” points by completing and submitting an application form.

1. 9th Grade	2. 5 points
3. 10th Grade	4. 10 points
5. 11th Grade	6. 15 points

7. If there is a tie at the end of the year, the individuals involved will go in front of a four-person board composed of two SCUSBC Board Members.
